



UNDERSTANDING ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE



FOR TEACHERS

THE DO'S AND DON'TS

Address AI use in your class, set expectations

Ask Al for help lesson planning, preparing activities, and personalization/differentiation

Adjust lessons or create new learning experiences that A.I. cannot do for students

Use A.I. to provide timely and constructive feedback to students

Don't treat A.I. like a substitute, it is a supplement

Don't enter any students' personal information in A.I. chatbots

Don't ignore A.I. - it is going to be everywhere. Be proactive, not reactive

Don't blindly trust everything A.I. generates. Check for accuracy, bias, and relevance

RULES FOR AI IN THIS CLASSROOM

Use AI responsibly and transparently to enhance learning, not replace it.

RESPONSIBILITY

Take **responsibility** for your learning and develop your own skills.

TRANSPARENCY

Anything generated by AI must be **clearly marked** and distinguished from your own work.

You must **be prepared to discuss** your thought process or explain how you used AI to inform your work.

INTEGRITY

Only use AI tools if explicitly instructed to by the teacher

Using AI to plagiarize or submit work that is not your own is a **serious** academic integrity violation.

You are responsible for ensuring that all information you submit, regardless of the source, **is accurate and properly cited**.
